






Trafficked Youth: Six Distinct Profiles of Individual and Family/Peer Vulnerability






Similar Profiles Differentiated by Foster Care or by Alcohol/Drug Vulnerability

- Organized Crime Groups/Gangs
- Fraudulent/Exploitive Employment

Transient Populations/ Areas

- Tourism/Sex Tourism, Conventioneers
- Truck Stops, Airports
- International Border Areas

Economy

- Reliant on Sex Industry, Seasonal Workers
- Poverty
- Limited Employment Opportunities



Vulnerability: Community Response

Criminal Justice

- Inadequate Police Training
- Limited Prosecutions of Human Trafficking

Service Providers

- Training Needed
- Weak Social Safety Net for Most Vulnerable
- Inadequate Protective Strategies

Safeguard Potential Victims

- Lack of Knowledge regarding Danger
- No Safety Planning with Vulnerable Persons
